

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
<u>Did You Know that Title Insurance</u> <u>Benefits Our Nation?</u>

Lemon Ice Box Pie

Crust: Crushed Vanilla Wafers; mix with melted butter. Form crust in pie pan.

Filling:

1 can Sweetened Condensed Milk

3 egg yolks (save whites for meringue)

1/2 cup Lemon Juice

2 drops Yellow Food Coloring

Beat egg yolks well, fold in milk, add lemon juice and food coloring, blend well.. Pour into crust.

Meringue:

3 egg whites

1/3 cup Sugar

1/4 teaspoon Cream of Tartar

Beat egg whites with cream of tartar. Once whites peak, slowly add sugar. Periodically feel meringue for graininess. Continue beating until the graininess disappears. Top pie with meringue—filling edges first. Bake at 350 degrees until browned. Cool then refrigerate.

OR forget the meringue—tent with aluminum foil, bake 10 min, cool, place in freezer.



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Prioritizing Home Maintenance & Repairs



When making your "to do" list for necessary repairs and regular maintenance, you should start your list with the items that will protect your family from harm. Below is a list of potentially hazardous areas that should be top priority on your list:



- Railings & Banisters: Make sure that all of the hardware is securely fastened to the wall support structures to prevent serious falls. Replace split or worn railings.
- Walkway Cracks & Uneven Walkways: The outdoor walkways tend to be overlooked, but cracked and uneven areas could easily cause a trip and fall which could potentially cause severe injury.
- **Smoke Detectors**: If you don't have them; get them. If you do have them; check the batteries regularly. A good rule of thumb is that when you change your calendar to the next month; check the batteries.
- **Lighting**: Make sure to replace burned out bulbs in walkways and hallways right away. You don't want anyone to trip and fall because they cannot see where they are going. Also make sure that your front and back entry lights and any security lights are working properly and do not have burned out bulbs.
- **Steps**: Check porch steps regularly to make sure that they are not rotting or loose. A broken or unstable step can be very hazardous.
- **Electrical Outlets**: Test all indoor and outdoor outlets to make sure that the ground-fault circuits are working properly. A damaged outlet can short out and cause an electrical fire.
- **Windows**: Repair loose or broken latches, replace cracked or broken panes especially on lower level where unwanted entry is more likely.
- **Garage Doors**: Garage doors that do not close properly or have an unreliable electric opener are the perfect point of entry for burglars.
- **Security Systems**: Even the most basic electronic security system can provide a more protected and secure feeling. It is a deterrent to potential invaders plus most insurance companies provide discounts on your homeowner insurance when you have an alarm system in place.
- **Gutters and Downspouts**: It's a dirty job, but an absolute must, even if you have gutter guards. Birds seem to find ways to build nests and tree seeds can start growing in the gutters. Add gutter hoses to your downspouts to direct rainwater away from your home. This will prevent water from seeping into crawl spaces and basements.
- **Roof**: Even the newest roof can have damage from severe storms. Check your roof regularly; a leak can cause expensive damage and untreated leaks can develop mold which is hazardous to your health.
- **Paint**: The wood on your house needs protection; check the paint regularly to see if you need to add another coat, repair rotted or damaged areas, or simply add a touch up. New interior paint gives an added freshness to the home and you can change the look of a room simply by changing the paint color.
- Caulk: Check the caulking around sinks, tubs, showers, and toilets. An inexpensive tube of caulk goes a long way in preventing water damage around these fixtures.
- **Plumbing**: Open the cabinet doors and look for water. Leaking pipes can rot your cabinetry and develop mold. Find a leak; fix it immediately and prevent the damage before it's too late.
